About the Programme

The direct-entry Bachelor of Science in Nursing is a four-year degree programme which aims to equip you with the skills and competencies needed to function in areas such as patient-centred care, teamwork and interprofessional practice, evidence-based practice, quality improvement and use of informatics and technology to enhance quality of care.

Core Curriculum

The programme will take advantage of the extensive Aga Khan Health Services network of hospitals and clinics, emerging innovations in electronic health records, telemedicine, data science, interprofessional learning between medicine and nursing students and simulation learning within AKU. Similarly, electives in emerging areas such as geriatrics, mental health, maternal child health, home based care will enhance the appeal of our students in rapidly changing healthcare environment.

- 1st Year: Foundation Courses (Basic Sciences)
- 2nd Year: Nursing concepts and Nursing Practice
- 3rd Year: Community; Research; Midwifery; Specialty Areas
- 4th Year: Nursing Leadership and Management; Electives

You will attend classes and conduct clinical rotations for five days each week.

In addition, you will have one-on-one time with faculty to gain clarity on any aspects that were not understood in the class and clinical settings. You will also have access to mentorship from faculty as well as regular assessments from the faculty to ensure you make continual progress. Your clinical practice skills will be enhanced through guided learning that takes place in hospitals and community-based health facilities approved by the Nursing Council of Kenya.

Provisional Applications

The Aga Khan University will also accept provisional applications. In cases where provisional admission is granted, candidates will be required to submit their pending examination results slips/certificates or their graduation/postgraduate examination results in accordance with the minimum eligibility requirements.

The University does not process incomplete applications including those that do not meet eligibility requirements or are submitted, for any reason, after the stated deadline.

Eligibility Criteria

- Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) or its Equivalent with minimum aggregate of C+ (plus) and C+ in each of the following subjects: English/Kiswahili, Mathematics/Physics, Chemistry and Biology
- For applicants from IGCSE backgrounds as well as other foreign qualifications, you should first obtain an equation certificate from the Kenya National Qualifications Authority (www.knqa.go.ke) which will translate your results and enable AKU to align them with our minimum aggregate requirements
